History of 21st July

- ◆ **1658** : Aurangzeb celebrated his unofficial coronation.
- ◆ **1883** : India's first public theater hall, Star Theatre, was started in Kolkata.
- ◆ **1947** : The Constitution adopted the national flag.
- ◆ **1962** : There was a war on the border between India and China.
- ◆ **1969** : Neil Armstrong stepped on the moon.
- ◆ **2007** : Pratibha Patil became the first woman President of India.

Current Affairs Related to 21st July 2024

- ◆ The World Bank's Board of Executive Directors approved financial assistance of \$1.5 billion for India, which will help accelerate the development of low carbon energy. The objective of this operation will be to promote the development of a vibrant market for green hydrogen, further scale up critical energy, and incentivize finance for low carbon energy investments.
- ◆ The Government of India has released \$2.5 million from \$5 million for the year 2024-2025 to the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East. The money will be used to provide education, health care and other services to Palestinian refugees. According to the Government of India, they have provided \$35 million to the United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East until 2023-2024.
- ◆ Indore created a world record by planting 11 lakh saplings in a day. By planting more than 11 lakh saplings in just 24 hours, Indore achieved a new Guinness World Record in the category of most trees planted by a team in 24 hours. This program was organized by the state government. Earlier in the day, Union Home Minister Amit Shah participated in the Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam campaign and planted a sapling.
- ◆ Maharashtra government introduced bill to curb Naxalism in urban areas. Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis introduced the bill in the Assembly. This bill gives power to the government and police mantra to deal with illegal activities. The bill also proposes a prison sentence of three to seven years and a fine of Rs 3 to 5 lakh.
- ◆ The Institute of Translational Health Sciences and Technology under the Council of Biotechnology Research and Innovation hosted IHC 2024. The objective of the event was to strengthen scientific and industry collaboration across NBFCs, with a focus on advancing bio-production and bio-innovation.
- ◆ Claiming to increase the value of zero electricity bill for domestic consumers, the Himachal Pradesh Cabinet has also approved limiting electricity connections to one meter per household and linking electricity connections to ration cards. Earlier, electricity bill up to 125 units per month was free in Himachal Pradesh.
- ◆ One Scientist One Product Program has been launched by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research to improve research in the field of agriculture and animal husbandry. These crops include 289 climate resistant varieties and 27 biofortified varieties. Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan inaugurated the One Scientist, One Product programme. ICAR is also working on developing 100 new seed varieties and 100 agricultural technologies in 100 days under the Centre's 100-day action plan.
- ◆ State Bank of India and Bank of Baroda have increased their marginal cost of funds based lending rates. State Bank of India has increased MCLR by between 5 to 10 basis points over various tenures. It has revised its one-month MCLR by 5 basis points from 8.3 percent to 8.35 percent. This is the second time the MCLR has been increased in the last two months.
- ◆ National Narcotics Helpline Manas and Narcotics Control Bureau Zonal Office in Srinagar were launched by the Home Minister. Along with this, Shri Amit Shah will also release NCB's Annual Report 2023 and Compendium on Drug Free India. The objective of this meeting is to coordinate and coordinate the efforts of various central and state government agencies involved in combating drug trafficking and abuse in India.
- ◆ The research wing of the Uttarakhand Forest Department established the first bird gallery of Uttarakhand at Jolly Grant. This gallery displays highly regarded photographs of birds of Uttarakhand, providing tourists with fascinating glimpses of the birds of the state.
